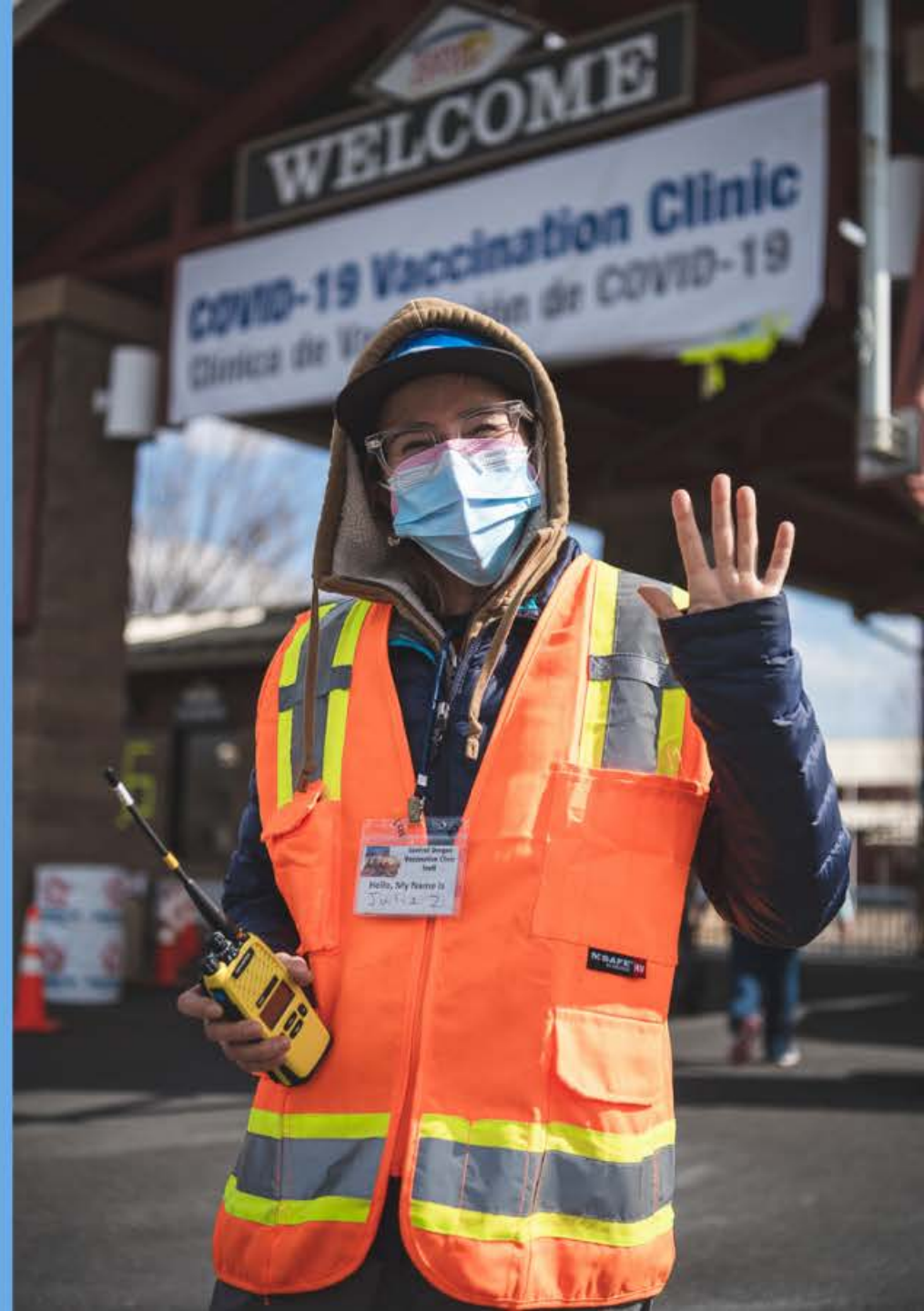

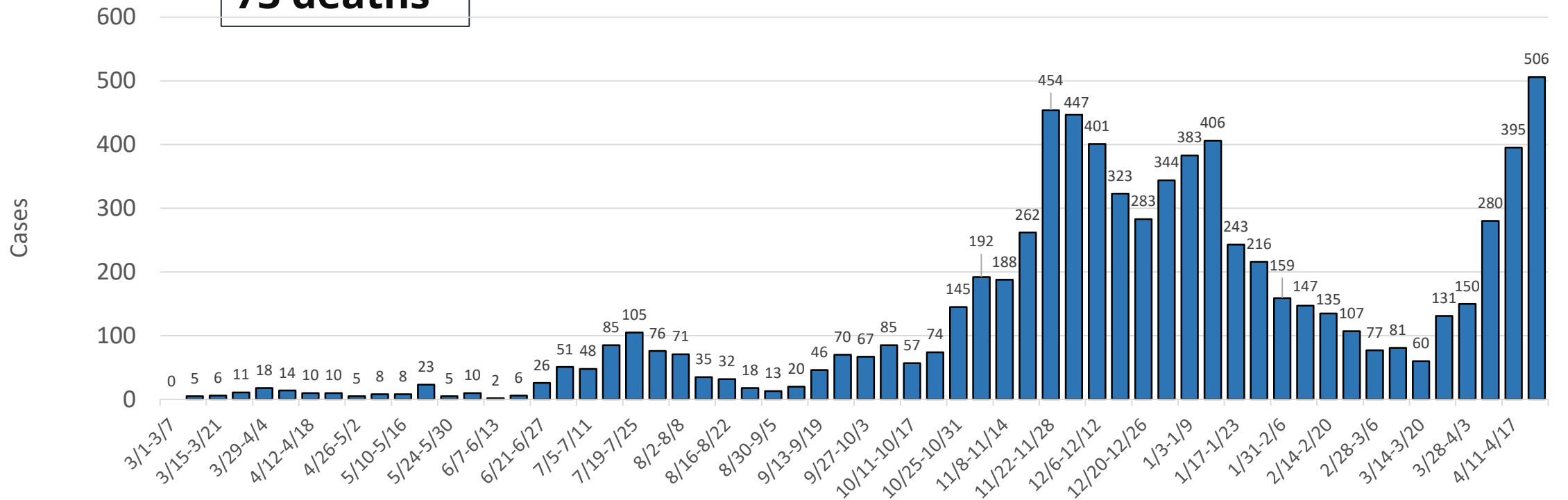

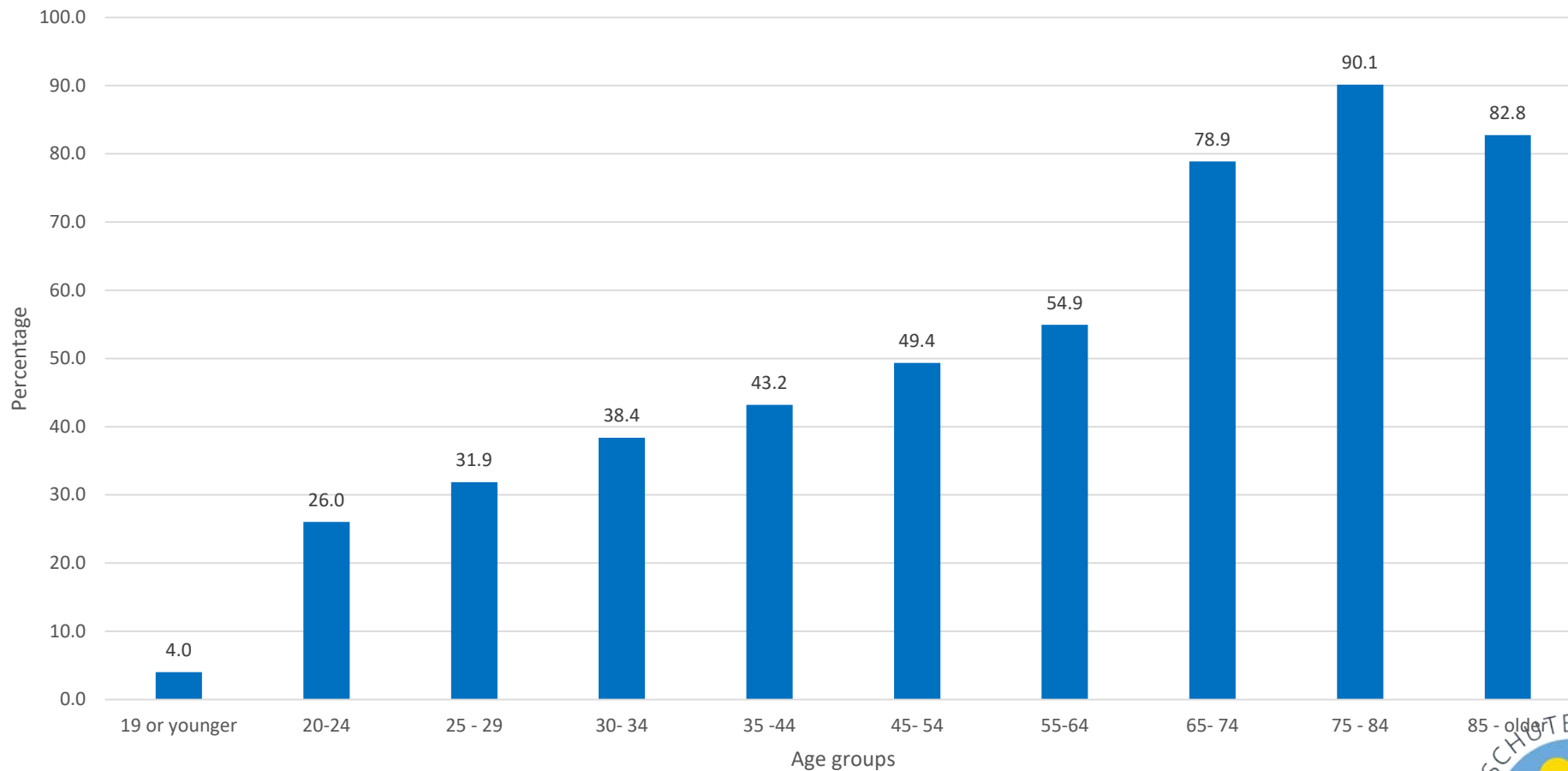

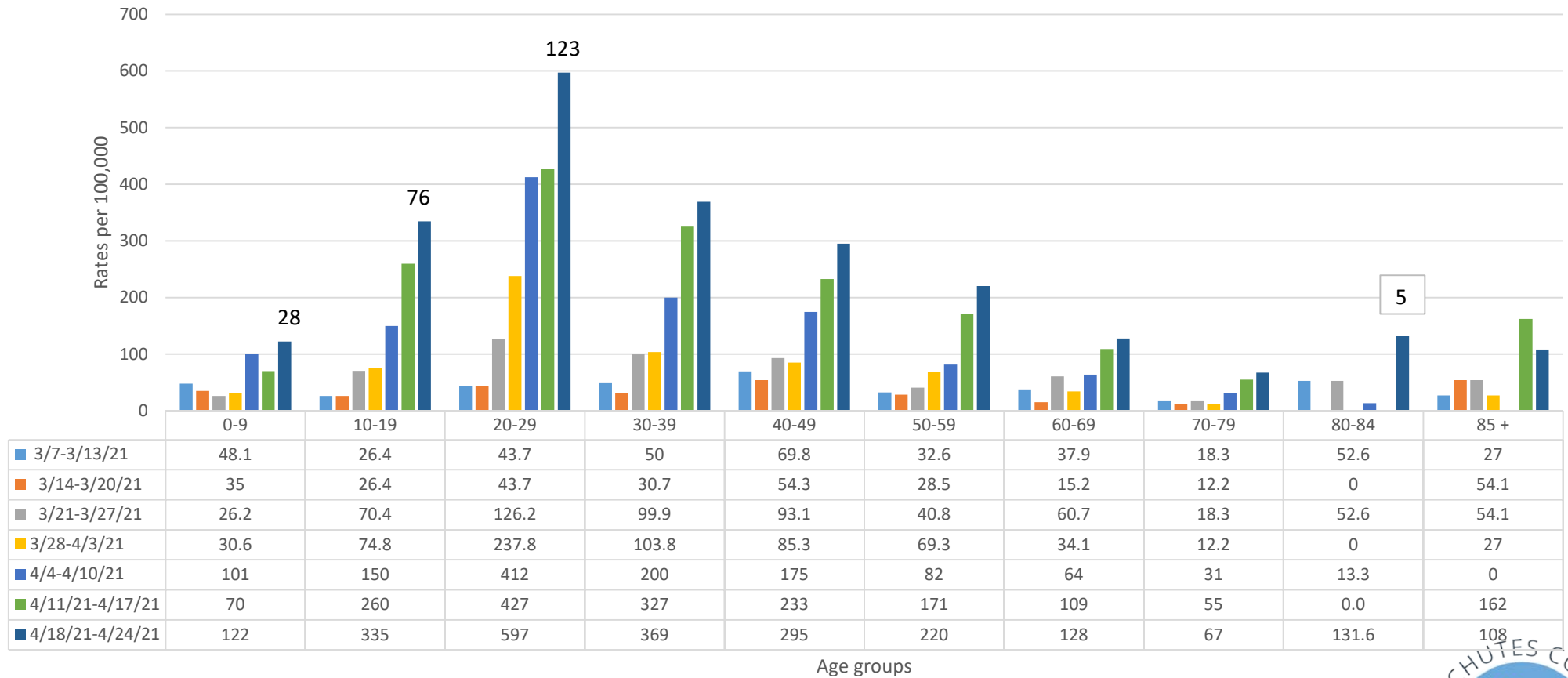
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COVID-19 vaccination as of April 18, 2021 by age groups in Deschutes County, regardless of race/ethnicity.

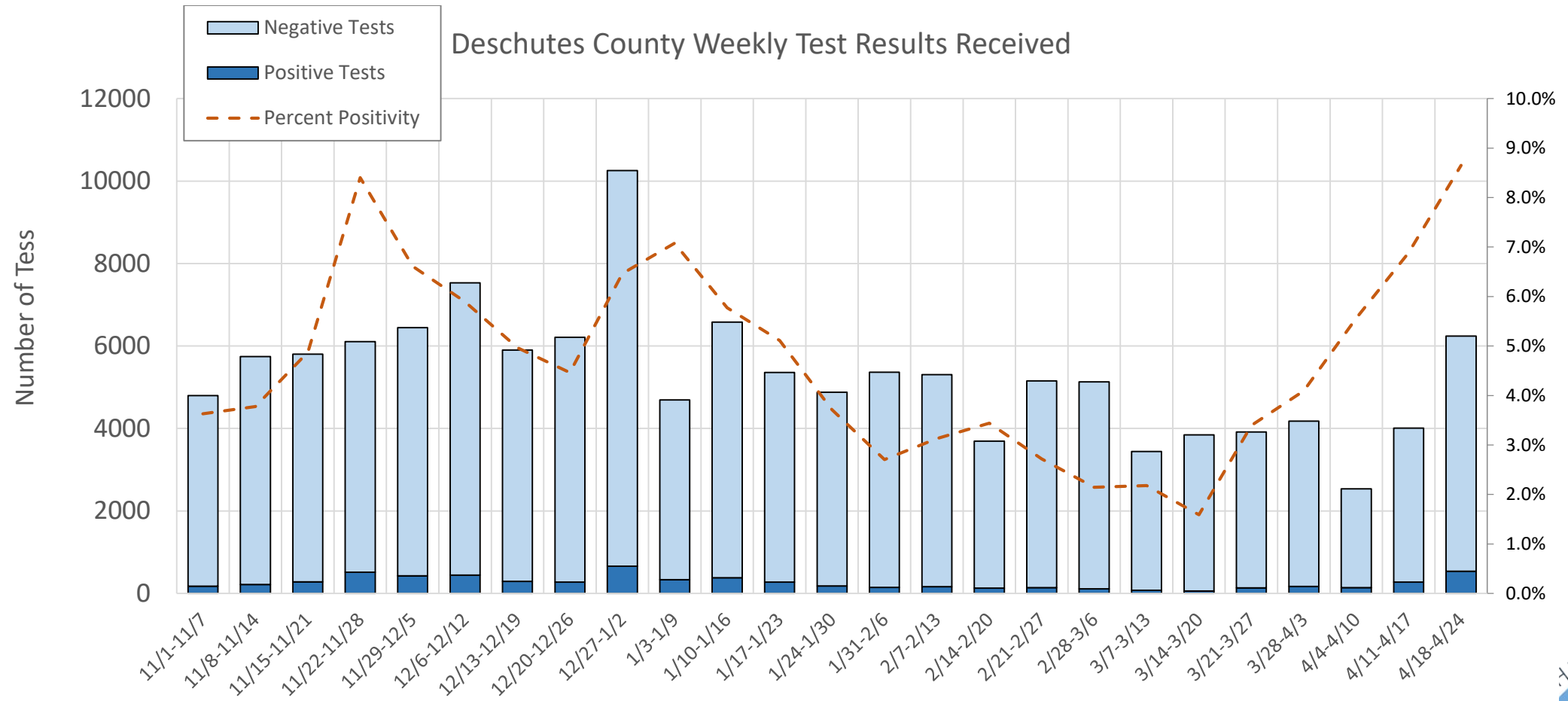

To stay well and protect others...



Stay 6 feet away from others not living in your household



Wash hands often



Wear face coverings consistently and correctly in public

Extreme Risk

Summary of changes:

- No indoor dining – outdoor dining allowed
- Reduced retail capacity
- Reduced indoor fitness and recreation facility capacity
- Require remote work, if able
- Outdoor visitation at long-term care facilities only



Restaurant Revitalization Fund



U.S. Small Business
Administration

- *This program provides emergency assistance for eligible restaurants, bars, and other qualifying businesses impacted by COVID-19.*
- Established by the American Rescue Plan Act
- Will provide restaurants with funding equal to their pandemic-related revenue loss up to \$5 million per physical location and \$10 million per business.
- Not required to repay the funding
- Registration begins on Friday, April 30, 2021. Applications open on Monday, May 3, 2021.

These businesses can apply:

- Restaurants
- Food stands, food trucks, food carts
- Caterers
- Bars, saloons, lounges, taverns
- Snack and nonalcoholic beverage bars
- Bakeries (onsite sales to the public comprise at least 33% of gross receipts)
- Brewpubs, tasting rooms, taprooms (onsite sales to the public comprise at least 33% of gross receipts)
- Breweries and/or microbreweries (onsite sales to the public comprise at least 33% of gross receipts)
- Wineries and distilleries (onsite sales to the public comprise at least 33% of gross receipts)
- Inns (onsite sales of food and beverage to the public comprise at least 33% of gross receipts)
- Licensed facilities or premises of a beverage alcohol producer where the public may taste, sample, or purchase products

Allowable use of funds



U.S. Small Business
Administration

- Funds may be used for specific expenses including:
- Business payroll costs (including sick leave)
- Payments on any business mortgage obligation
- Business rent payments (note: this does not include prepayment of rent)
- Business debt service (both principal and interest; note: this does not include any prepayment of principal or interest)
- Business utility payments
- Business maintenance expenses
- Construction of outdoor seating
- Business supplies (including protective equipment and cleaning materials)
- Business food and beverage expenses (including raw materials)
- Covered supplier costs
- Business operating expenses

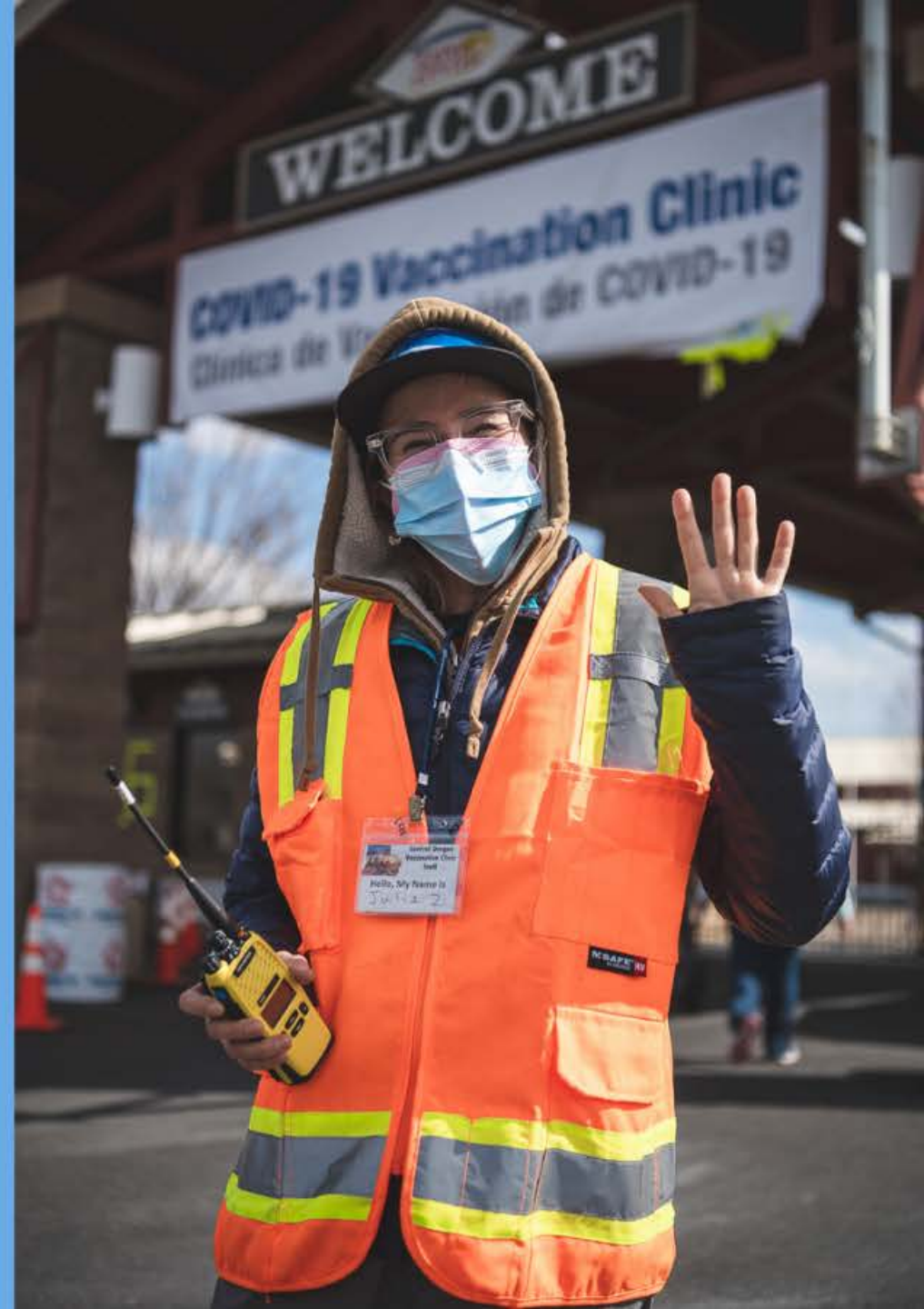

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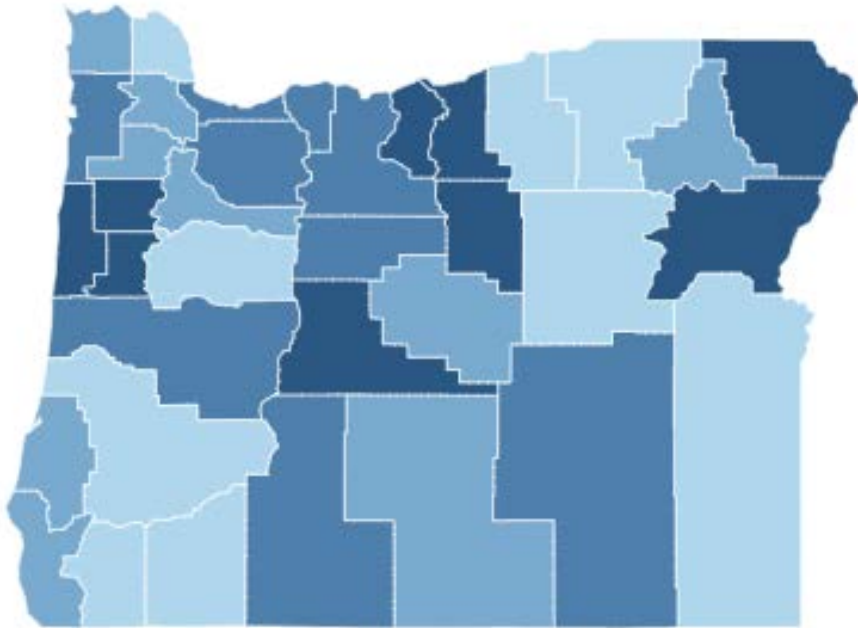

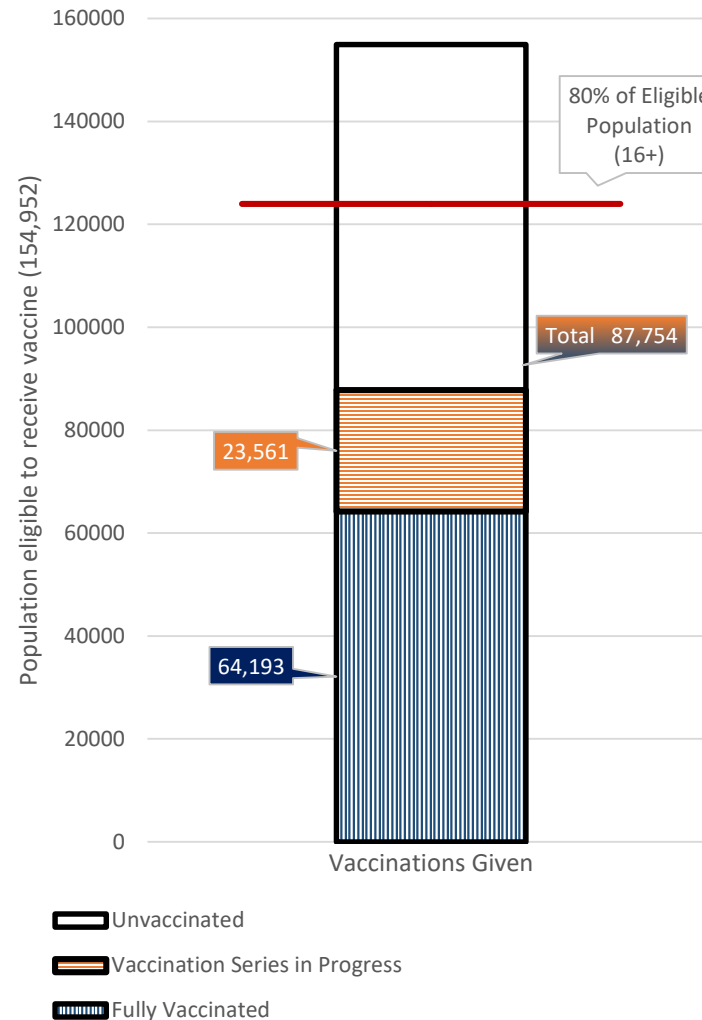
