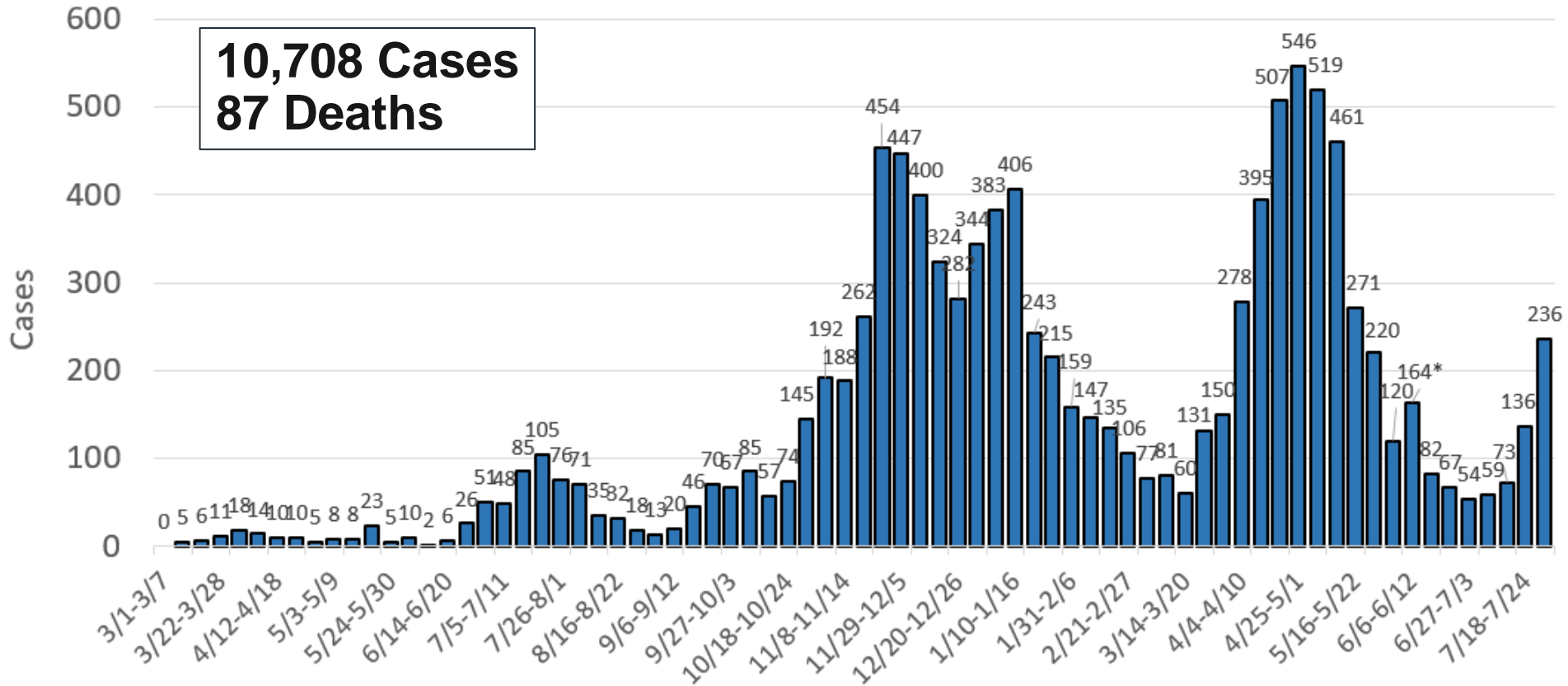

COVID-19 Case Counts by Week

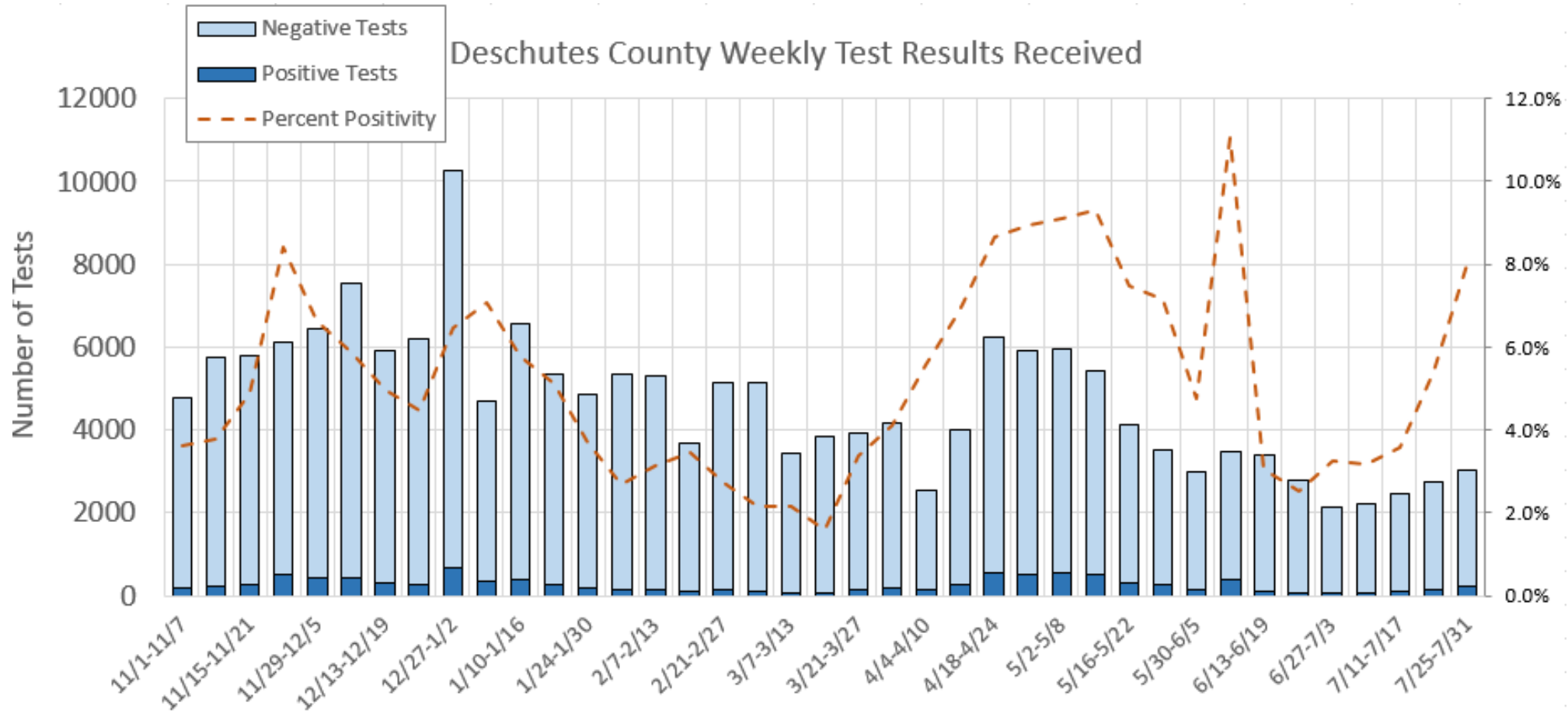
Deschutes County Known COVID-19 Cases by Week

COVID-19 Test Results by Week



When to get tested?

- Before and after travel*
- If you have symptoms
- 6 to 9 days after you were exposed to someone who tests positive

*For some travel locations, if you had a positive test for COVID-19 within 90 days, you can use this to permit travel



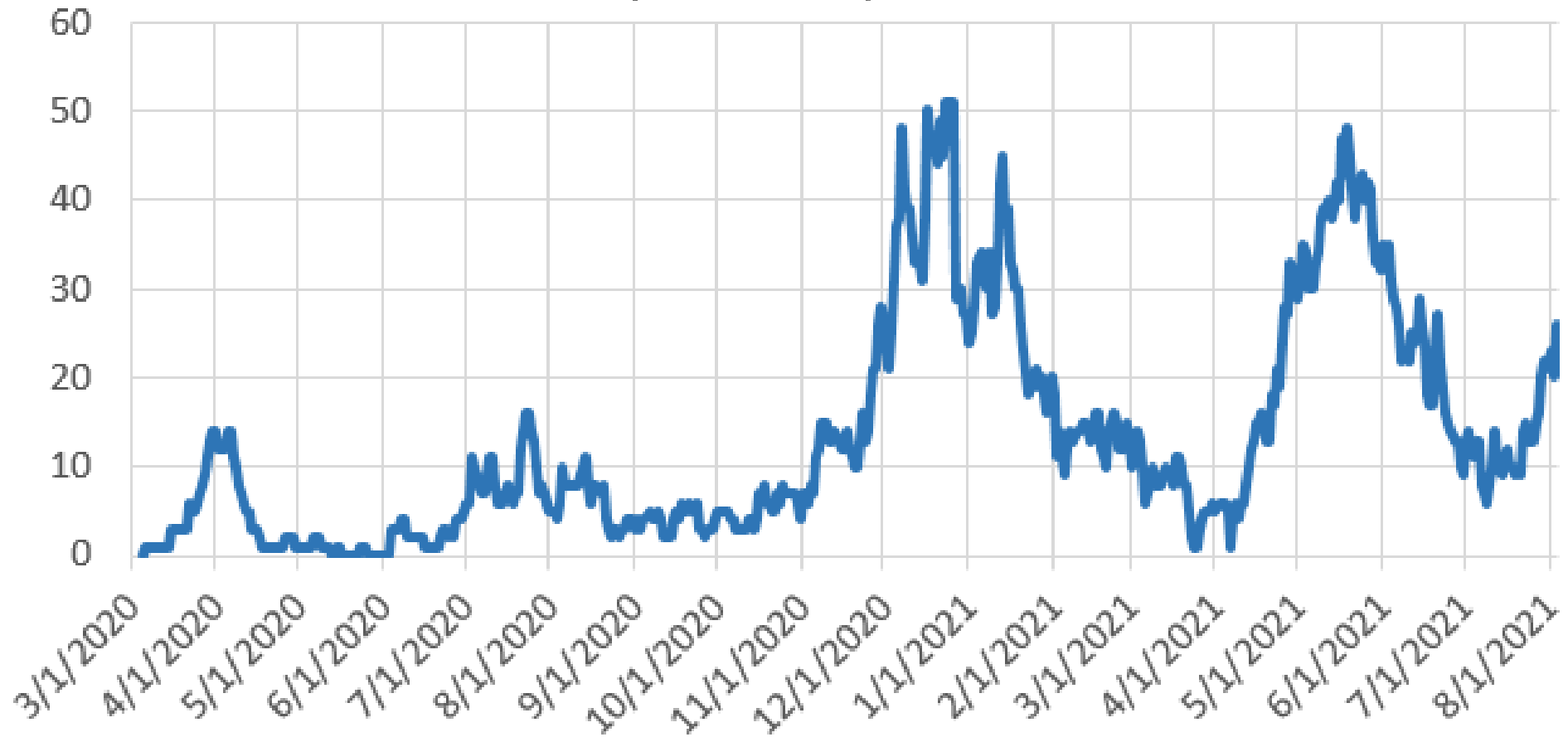
Testing for travel

- **Know the requirements – most locations require PCR test results within 72 hours**
- **Visit www.deschutes.org/covidtesting**
- **Find a location on the OHA testing locator that meets your needs**
- **Call ahead to confirm test type and turnaround time**
- **Get tested and travel safely!**

St. Charles Health System - Hospitalized COVID Patients

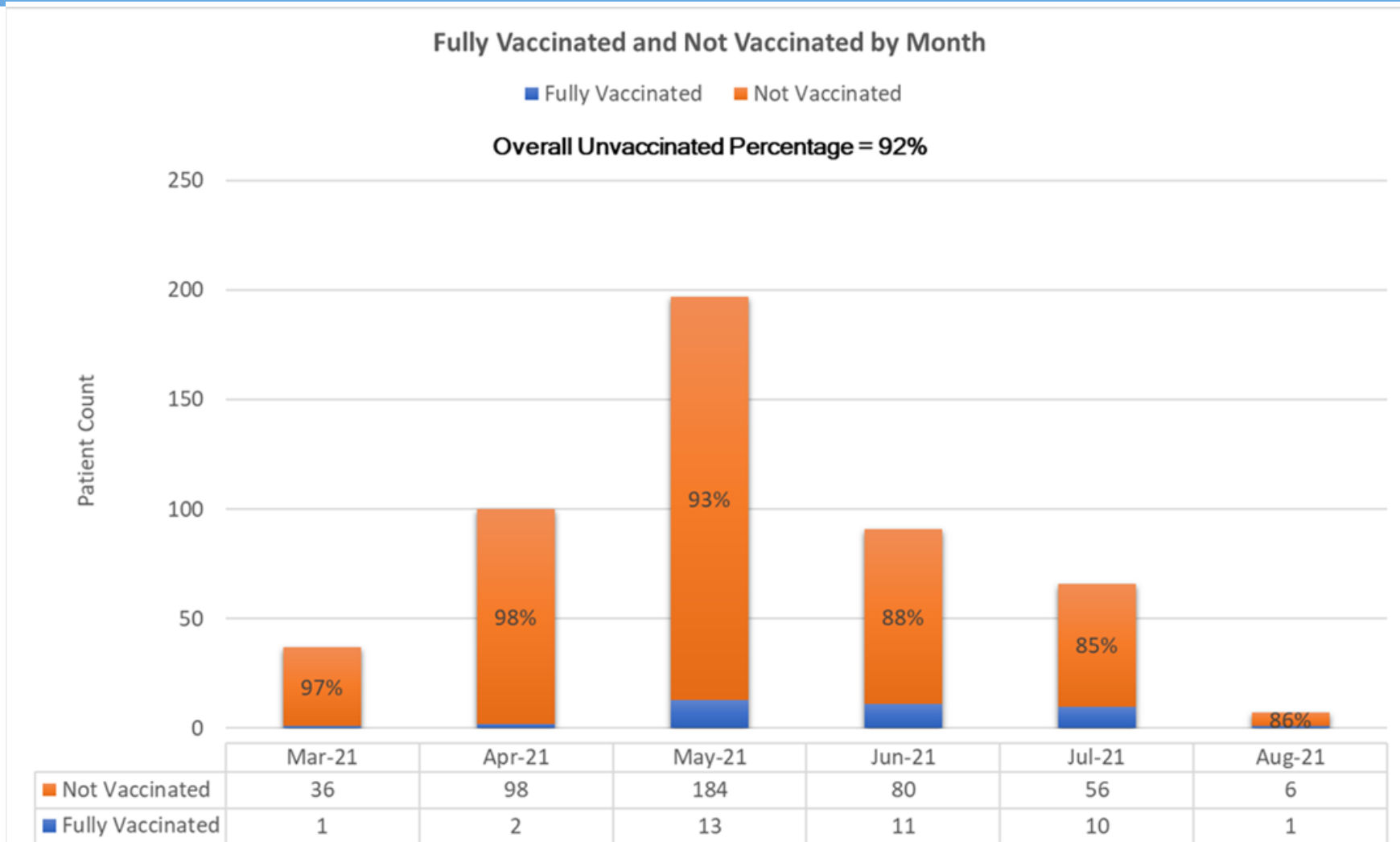

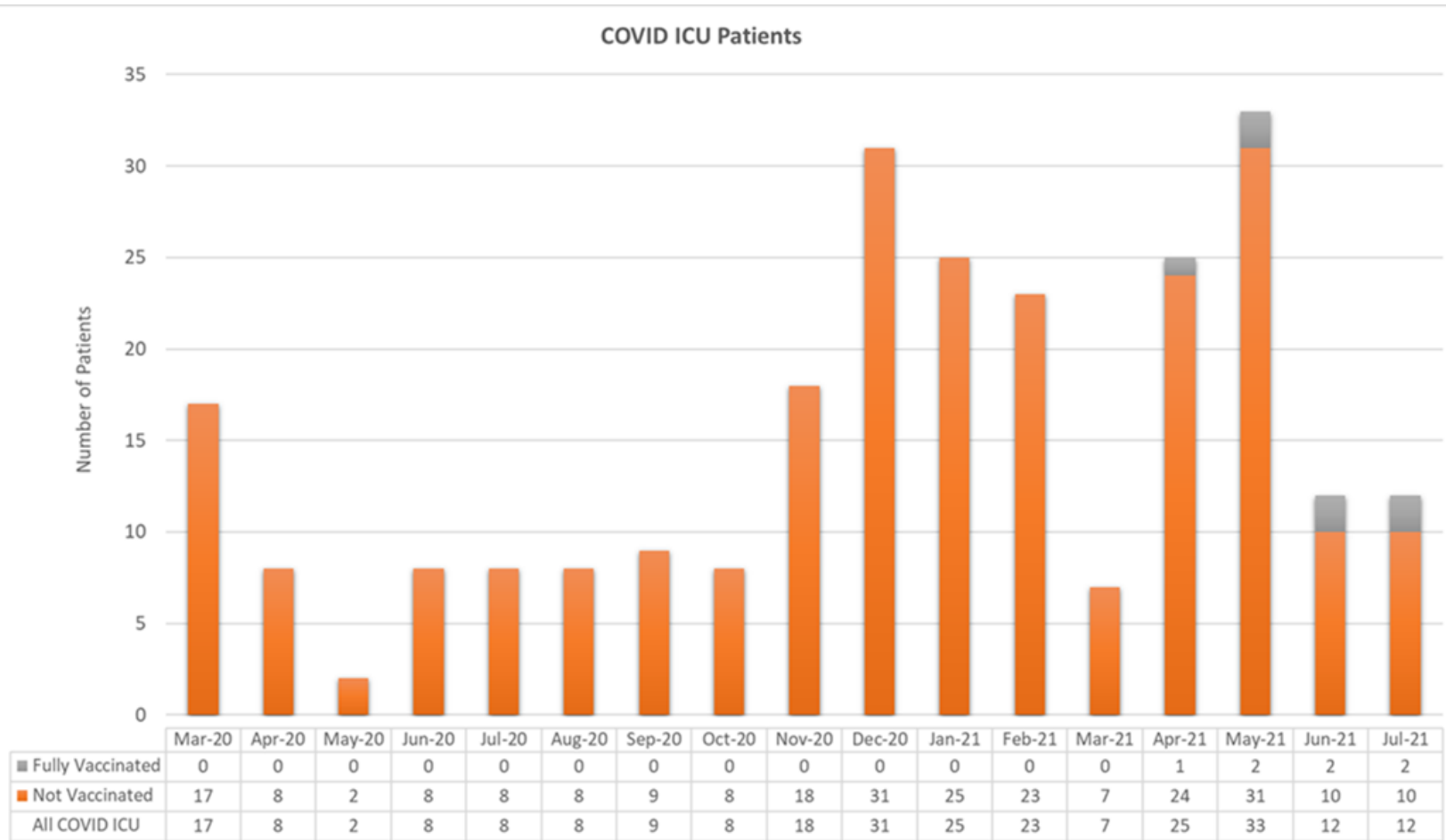

Community Spread is Substantial

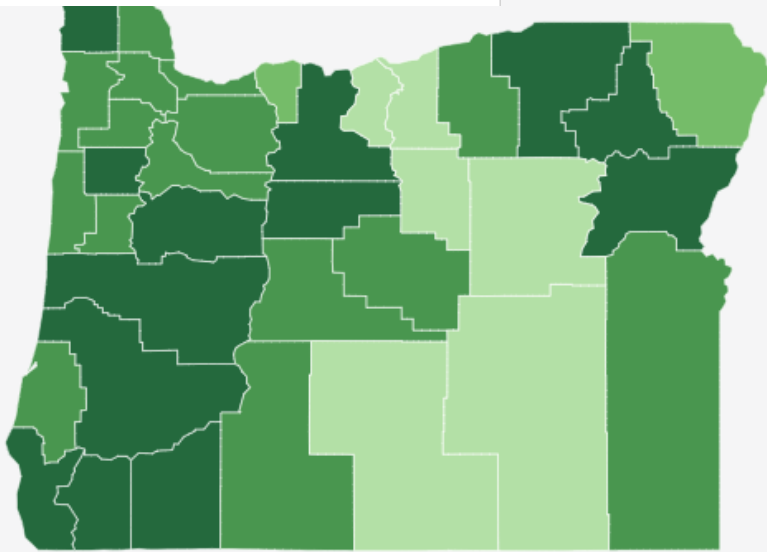
Community spread in **Deschutes County** is currently **Substantial**.

Data from 07/18/2021 - 07/31/2021 show:

373 confirmed and presumptive cases

189.3 cases per 100,000 residents

6.8% test positivity rate

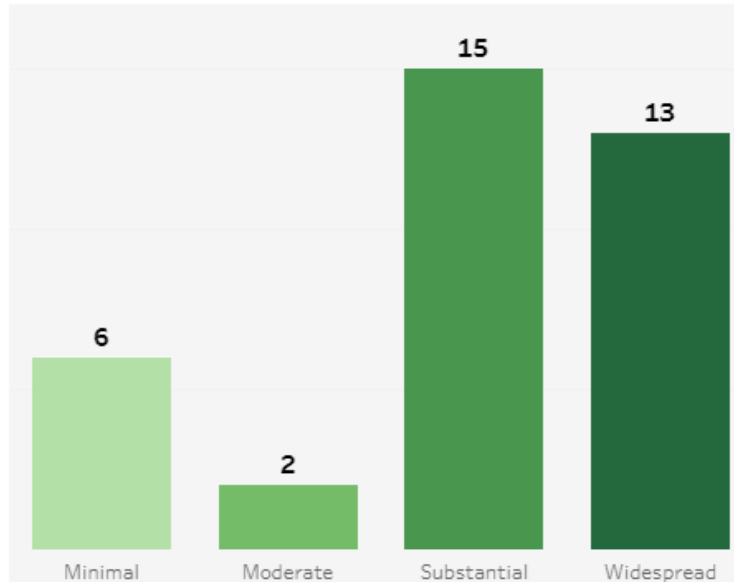

Counties by Level of Community Spread

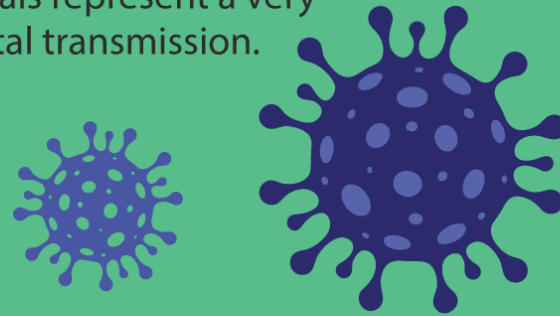


Guidance Based On New Data

SHOULD I BE CONCERNED ABOUT THE DELTA VARIANT?

New data show Delta is different than past versions of the virus: it is much more contagious.

- Vaccinated people can get breakthrough infections of Delta variant and may be contagious.
- Vaccinated individuals represent a very small amount of total transmission.

DO I NEED TO WEAR A MASK?

In areas of substantial or high transmission, everyone should wear a mask in public indoor settings to help prevent the spread of Delta variant and protect others.

Guidance Based On New Data

ARE VACCINES EFFECTIVE?

Yes! Getting vaccinated prevents severe illness, hospitalization, and death; it also helps reduce the spread of the virus in communities.

With the Delta variant, vaccination is more urgent than ever.

WHAT SHOULD COMMUNITIES DO?

Community leaders should encourage vaccination and masking to prevent further outbreaks, especially in areas of substantial or high transmission.

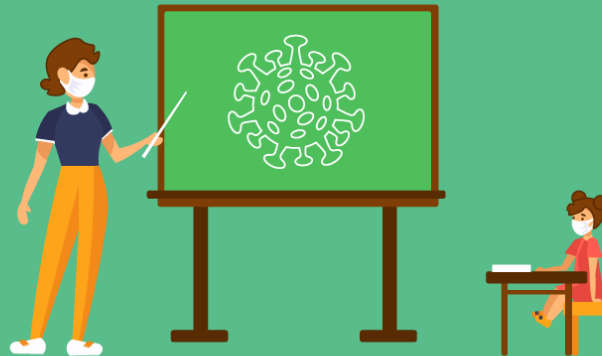

Guidance Based On New Data

WHAT SHOULD SCHOOLS DO?

CDC recommends universal indoor masking for all teachers, staff, students, and visitors to K-12 schools, regardless of vaccination status. Children should return to full-time in-person learning in the fall with layered prevention strategies in place.

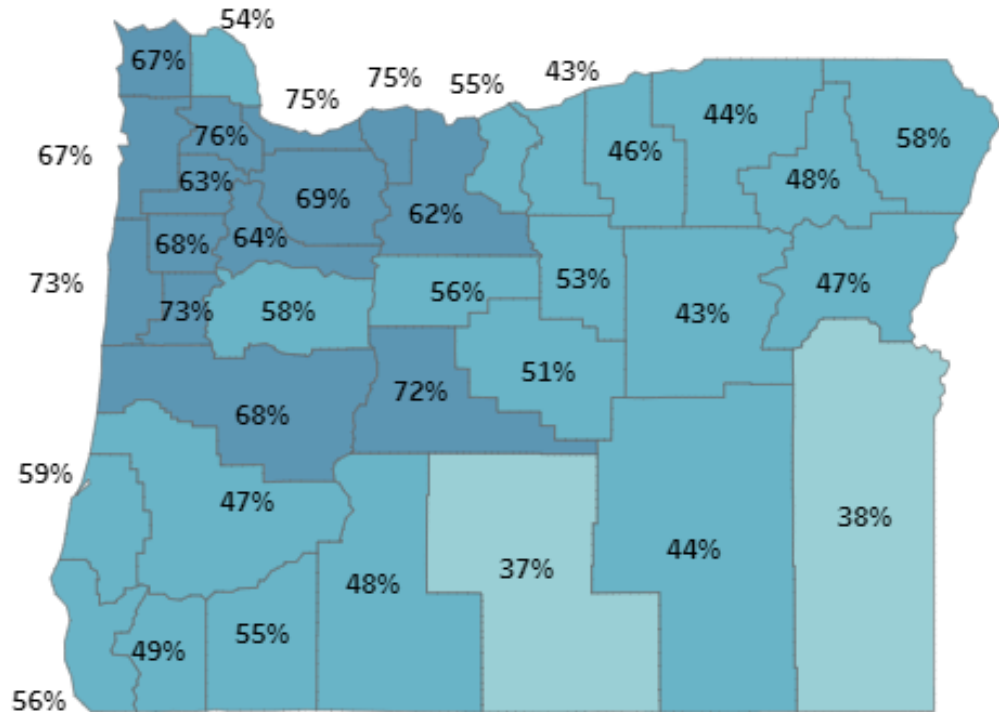

COVID-19 Vaccinations in Deschutes County

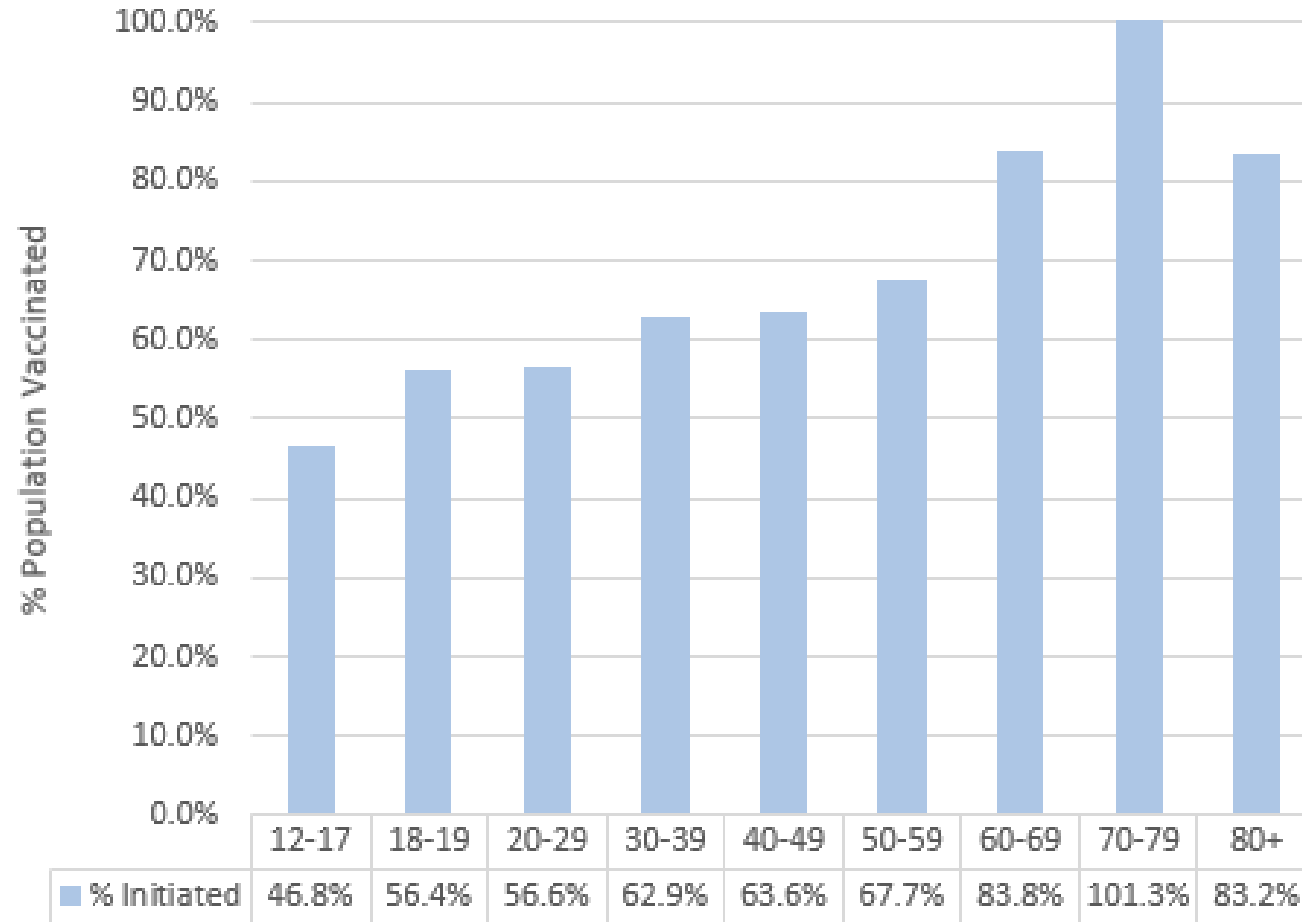

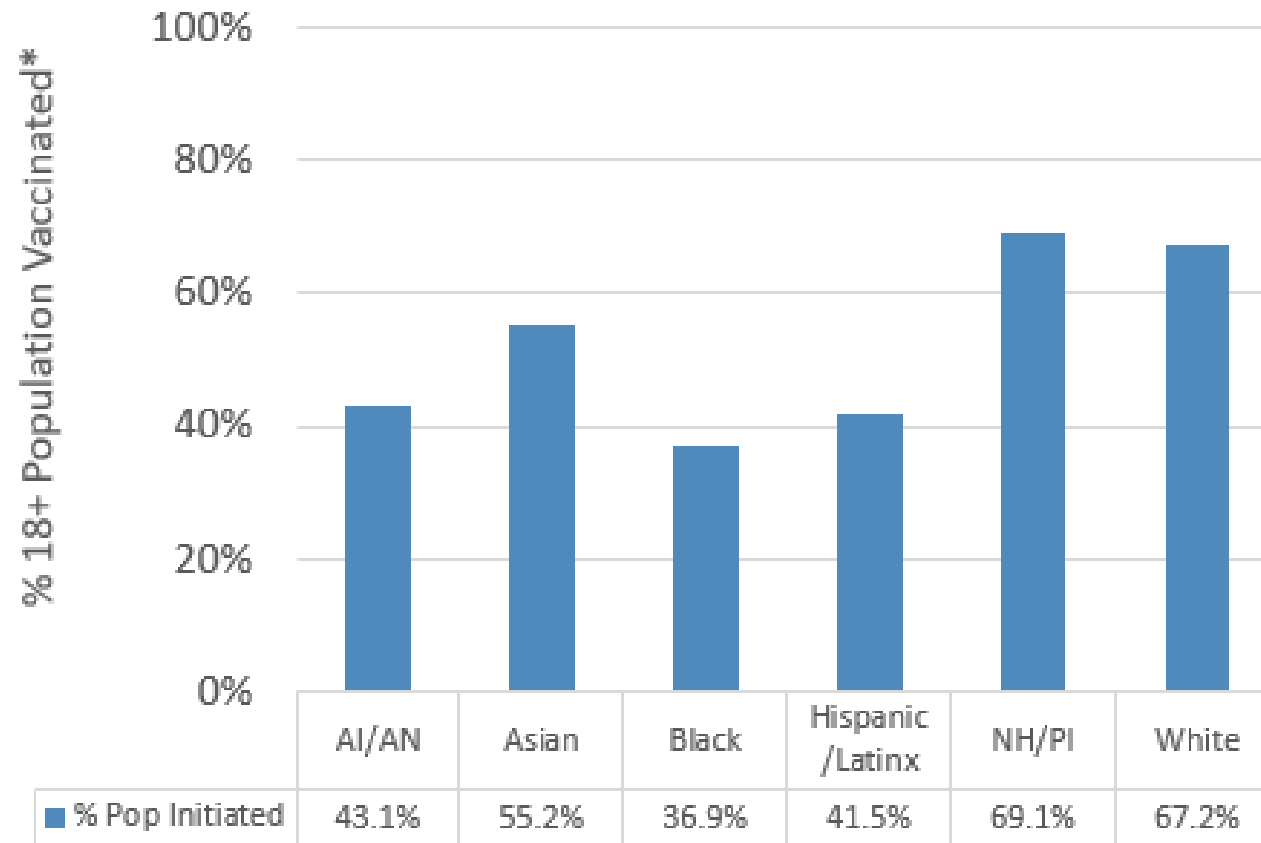
