COVER IT UP! KEEP THE COUNTY CLEAN.



By covering your load, you contribute to a safer, cleaner, and more responsible community.

- **Prevent Accidents and Injury:** Uncovered loads can result in debris falling onto the road, posing hazards to other drivers, vehicles, pedestrians, cyclists and potentially causing accidents.
- **Reduce Litter and Pollution:** Covering your load prevents trash and contaminants from being scattered along roadsides and into natural areas, protecting wildlife and keeping the county and waterways clean.
- **Cost Savings:** Covering your load gives you \$10 off the cost of your garbage disposal and saves the cost of municipal cleanup efforts.
- Avoid Fines: County Ordinance 13.36.040 states that all transport to the landfill must be covered and secured. You could risk a \$720 fine imposed by law enforcement.
- **County Pride:** Keeping roads and public spaces clean enhances the county appearance.



WONDERING HOW TO KEEP YOUR WASTE SECURE DURING TRANSIT?

Load Containment Guidelines:

- Ensure your load is fully contained within your vehicle or container.
- If using garbage cans, tied bags, or other containers, keep them within the vehicle's sidewalls. If they extend above the sidewalls, tarp them!
- Use a large enough tarp, securely fastened, to prevent materials from escaping during transit.
- Secure brush, building materials, and other bulky items with ropes, straps, or within the vehicle's walls.
- For concrete, asphalt, stumps, etc., ensure they are completely contained within the vehicle's sidewalls.
- Before leaving the drop-off area, check for and remove any debris that could fly out.

Before You Hit the Road, Ask Yourself:

- **Can Debris Fly Out Onto the Road?** Keep our roads clean and safe for everyone.
- Would I Feel Safe Following My Vehicle? Secure your load to protect fellow drivers.
- Would I Want My Vehicle Driving Through My Neighborhood? Show pride in your community by preventing litter.
